Academic calendar	Autumn semester: medio August – medio December Spring semester: primo January – medio June
Nominations	Deadlines for nominations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 15 April for autumn semester. 15 October for spring semester.
Applications	Kristiania University College uses an online nomination and application system for incoming exchange students. Before the student can apply the home institution must officially nominate the student using the Nomination portal. Nominated students are then invited to register an application in the application portal. Instructions on how to use the portals may be found on our website.
Shorter exchanges	All programmes are open for shorter exchanges.

Courses offered in English	Kristiania University College offers both a wide variety of bachelor and master courses taught in English. These courses, including past courses, are listed on our website.
Course structure and study plans	Please view available subjects/courses in English on our website.
Structure of study programmes	Bachelor: 3 years, 180 ECTS. Most courses give 7,5 ECTS. Master: Modules of 3-4 weeks. 2 years full time, 3 years part time, 120 ECTS.
Grading system	The Norwegian grading system consists of two grading scales: one scale with the grades pass or fail and one graded scale from A to E for pass and F for fail. The graded scale has the following qualitative descriptions: A – Excellent; B – Very good; C – Good; D – Satisfactory; E – Sufficient; F – Fail. The scale is used absolutely (criterion referenced assessment).
Transcript of record	The student can order a transcript of record in “Studentweb” for a limited time after the exchange (approx. 6 mths). A digital transcript (pdf) will be generated automatically to the document folder in your profile.

Welcome session	Arranged by the Dept. of Research Administration and Internationalisation at the beginning of the each semester.
Buddy system	Each exchange student will be allocated a buddy.
Evaluations	Incoming students will be called in for an evaluation session before the end of the semester by the Dept. of Research Administration and Internationalisation.
Accommodation	Apply for affordable student housing through ‘The Student Welfare Organisation of Oslo and Akershus’ (SiO) as soon as possible: https://www.sio.no/en/housing
Health and travel insurance	Students are responsible for appropriate medical insurance and a private insurance/travel insurance to cover dental care or cover injuries or damage caused to other people's belongings or property. European students must bring their European health insurance card.
